

## AJO/ADALAT kicks off a 10 days training to Legal Aid Providers (LAPs) of Ministry of Justice (MoJ) on Substantive Laws

On November 01, 2020, AJO/ADALAT started a 10 days training program for the Legal Aid Providers of MOJ on substantive laws. The training participants include LAPs from Kabul and provinces. A tota of 25 participants from Kabul and provinces of Badakhshan, Baghlan, Parwan, Kunduz, Takhar, Paktiya, Juzjan, Nangarhar, Herat, Balkh attend the training. Of the 25 participants 2 of them are female. The topics of the training include general rules and elements of the criminal code, types of crimes with attention to aggravating and mitigating circumstances of punishment, elements of crimes and case study. Besides; the participants are provided with one volume of the criminal code interpretation along with the training handbook as reading materials. The

participants will also be provided with certificates at the end of the training program.
